



WCRA S4 Semi-Finals Ground Rules, Payout Advancement and Tie-Breaks

- By December 1st, 2019 at 11:59:59pm for all disciplines –
 - All athletes inside of the top 64 in the timed events and top 24 in the rough stock events will advance to WCRA S4 Semi-Finals.
 - All athletes are eligible to compete in each discipline one time
- Semi Finals Exemptions:
 - Timed Events:
 - The Top 8 athletes in the WCRA Leaderboard standings are exempt into the Final Round of the Semi Finals and will not be required to pay an entry fee.
 - The number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is exempt to the WCRA \$1MM Major.
 - The Top 9-16 athletes in the WCRA Leaderboard standings are exempt into the Progressive Round of the Semi-Finals and will not be required to pay an entry fee.
 - The remaining timed event athletes will compete in the Preliminary Round and will pay a \$250 entry fee.
 - All exempt timed event athletes shall not compete in the preliminary rounds.
 - Rough Stock:
 - S4 will have no exemptions into the Final Round.
 - All S4 rough stock athletes will compete at the 2020 Lewis Feild Bulls and Broncs event on Feb. 7-8, 2020.
 - Any athletes that advance to LFBB that are outside of the Top 24 on the WCRA Leaderboard will pay a \$500 entry fee.
 - Entry fees will be \$250.00 with the exception of:
 - Athletes inside of the Top 8 on the WCRA Leaderboard in the Bareback and Saddle Bronc Riding
 - Top 12 Bull Riding athletes in the UTB, no entry fees
 - Bull Riding Semi Finals (see below for description).
- General Ground Rules
 - Splits:
 - All timed event splits must be declared two hours before the event start time.
 - Turn Outs and Non-Entries:
 - If an athlete does not enter, they will be replaced by a qualified athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard
 - If an athlete turns out once declared in their pool, they will NOT be replaced by qualification, but the position will be filled through competition.

- If an athlete turns out of the Preliminary Round, their position will not be filled.
 - If an athlete turns out of the Progressive Round or Final Round, their position will be filled through competition.
 - The penalty for a notified turnout is \$500.00. The penalty for a non-notified turnout is \$500.00 plus any applicable entry fees and/or stock charges associated with the entry. The athlete cannot participate in the WCRA platform until the penalty fee is paid.
- Trades
 - Preliminary Round to Progressive Round
 - Preferences for the Top 9 – 16 athletes will be given based on the WCRA Leaderboard during the entry process.
 - Trades will be available up to one hour after the conclusion of the Preliminary Round
 - Trades must be submitted to eventsecretary@wcrarodeo.com. Both parties must confirm the trade.
 - Progressive Round to Final Round
 - No trades will be available in the Final Round
 - In the event that we have an odd number of athletes placed in pools to advance to the next round, WCRA will take the highest score or fastest time out of the respective pool to fill the open position.
 - Times in the Steer Wrestling, Team Roping, Tie-Down Roping and Breakaway Roping will be recorded to the hundredths of seconds.
 - Times in the Barrel Race will be recorded to the thousandths of seconds.
 - Half points will be used in all rough stock events.
 - Barrel Racing Tractor Drag/Hand Rake
 - Preliminary Round
 - Tractor drag after every 5
 - WCRA may choose to hand rake after every run
 - Progressive Round
 - Hand rake after every run
 - Final Round
 - Hand rake after every run
 - Team Roping Rules –
 - Each athlete's individual point total from the WCRA leaderboard will determine qualification into the Semi-Finals. Combined partner point totals will determine the team's competition placement within the top 64.
 - At the conclusion of the segment cut off, all Headers/Heelers must enter the event through the WCRA VRQ entry tool.
 - Headers/Heelers will have an option to enter as a team
 - Must have your partners ID number to declare your partner and enter as a team. Both partners will be required to pay a separate

entry fee.

- Those that enter without declaring a partner will be provided a list of headers/heelers without a partner at the conclusion of the entry window
- A deadline will be set for those headers/heelers to confirm their partner
- Once the entry window is closed and all pairings are declared, competition placement for the Semi Finals will be determined based on the combined point totals between each team. The qualifications are as follows:
 - The top 17 – 64 combined point totals between the header/heeler will advance to the Preliminary Round
 - The top 9 – 16 combined point totals between the header/heeler will advance to the Progressive Round
 - The top 8 combined point totals between the header/heeler will advance to the Final Round
 - The number one header and heeler from the WCRA Leaderboard is exempt to the WCRA \$1MM Major.
 - The number one ranked header/heeler must rope together in the Semi-Finals
 - Headers/Heelers competing in the Preliminary Round
 - In the event there is an uneven number of headers/heelers, any vacancies must first be filled with the eligible headers/heelers
 - Once all eligible headers/heelers have declared a partner, the remaining headers/heelers without a partner will be allowed to choose a partner from the remaining field of entered athletes
 - Note: All athletes are eligible to compete in each discipline one time
- **Pools Format** - The intended format is as follows:
 - Rough Stock Events (DO47 LFBB, Feb. 1, 2020 Maverik Center, Salt Lake City, UT)
 - Bareback and Saddle Bronc Riding Semi Finals – Four pools of six athletes
 - Bull Riding:
 - Two pools of 6 athletes at LFBB
 - PBR Oklahoma City (OKC) UTB, Top 12 athletes eligible
 - Timed Events (Lazy E Arena, Jan. 8-12, 2020, Guthrie, OK)
 - Progressive Round – Four pools of eight athletes
 - Final Round – Two pools of eight athletes
 - In the event that limits are not reached, the pool structure will be modified to accommodate the number of qualifiers.

- **Pool Placement**

- Every effort will be made for an equal number of athletes in each pool.
- Progressive and Final Round Exemptions
 - The 8 athletes exempt to each round will be placed in their own pool.
 - The 8 athletes that compete in the Progressive Round and advance to the Final Round will be placed in their own pool.

- **Competition Order**

- Timed Events (Steer Wrestling, Team Roping, Tie-Down Roping, Barrel Racing, Breakaway Roping)
 - Preliminary Round –
 - Round One – Reverse Order of the WCRA Leaderboard
 - The qualification order will be as follows:
 - Nominate, Win, You're In (if not in the top 64)
 - Combined team points will determine the competition order in the team roping
 - WCRA Leaderboard Standings (64 – 17)
 - Round Two – Random Draw
 - Progressive Round – Random Draw
 - Final Round – Random Draw
- Rough Stock Events (Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding, Bull Riding)
 - Competition order will be a random draw

- **Competition Format**

- **Timed Events (Steer Wrestling, Team Roping, Tie-Down Roping, Barrel Racing, Breakaway Roping)**

- Preliminary Round
 - Consists of two full rounds
 - Each Preliminary go round will pay four positions
 - Two head aggregate will pay six positions
 - A total of thirty-two (32) athletes from each discipline advance to the Progressive Round. Those 32 will include:
 - The 9 – 16 (total of 8) exempt athletes from the WCRA Leaderboard
 - The remaining 24 athletes will be filled as follows:
 - Any athlete that places 1st through 4th place in either Preliminary Round will move into the Progressive

Round.

- The remaining places will be filled by the fastest times in the aggregate of both Preliminary Rounds.
- Progressive Round
 - Thirty-two (32) athletes in each timed event discipline will compete in the Progressive Round, with a total payout of \$20,000. The 32 will be divided into four (4) Pools [A, B, C, D] of eight (8) athletes in each pool.
 - Pools will be seeded as follows:
 - The 9 – 16 (total of 8 athletes) from the WCRA Leaderboard will be in a single pool
 - The remaining 24 athletes advancing from the Preliminary Rounds will be randomly drawn in to the remaining pools.
 - The order of competition within each pool will be set by random draw.
 - The two (2) fastest times, in each pool will advance to the Final Round
 - If there are not two (2) qualified times in a pool, the next position filled will be from the fastest time, not already qualified, from any Progressive Round pool. If there are still open spots in a pool to advance to the Final Round, the next spot will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard of that segment, of the athletes in that pool, with the open position(s).
- Final Round
 - The top eight (8) athletes will be exempt from the WCRA Leaderboard
 - Eight (8) athletes will advance from the Progressive Round
 - The sixteen (16) athletes, collectively, will be placed in two (2) pools; Pool A and Pool B
 - Pool A will be filled with the Top 8 exempt athletes
 - Pool B will be filled with the 8 athletes from the Progressive Round
 - The four (4) fastest times in each Final Round pool advance to the WCRA \$1MM Major.
 - The number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is exempt to the WCRA \$1MM Major.
 - The Final Round will pay out a total of \$35,000.
 - Eight (8) athletes in each discipline will advance to the WCRA \$1,000,000 Major on February 28, 2020 in Kansas City, MO.
 - If the number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is included in the top 8 of the Semi Finals, WCRA will advance the next fastest time from that athlete's pool.
- **Rough Stock Events** (*Bareback and Saddle Bronc Riding Only*)

- Up to twenty-four (24) athletes will compete in the Semi Finals on February 1, 2020 in Salt Lake City, UT. The performances will occur at 1pm and 7pm on the 1st of February.
- Four (4) pools of six athletes will compete in the Semi Finals with a total payout of \$55,000 per discipline.
- Positions in each pool will be based on preferences given in priority of the athletes WCRA Leaderboard points standings as of the end of the segment.
 - Perf 1: Pools A, B
 - Perf 2: Pools C, D
- Livestock will be designated to each pool.
- The stock will be drafted in order of the athlete's WCRA Leaderboard qualification.
 - Athletes must be present two hours prior to the start of the performance to draft their stock. If not present, the stock will be drawn for the athlete after the draft concludes.
- The two (2) highest scores from each pool will advance to the WCRA \$1MM Major.
- The number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is exempt to the WCRA \$1MM Major.
- If there are not two qualified scores in a pool, the next position filled will be from the highest score, not already qualified, from any pool of the Semi Finals. If there are still open spots in a pool to advance to the Major, the next spot will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard of that segment of the athletes in that pool with the open position(s).
- Eight (8) athletes in each discipline will advance to the WCRA \$1,000,000 Major on February 28, 2020 in Kansas City, MO.
 - If the number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is included in the top 8 of the Semi Finals, WCRA will advance the next highest score from that athlete's pool.
- **Rough Stock Events** (*Bull Riding Only*)
 - Athletes within the Top 24 of the WCRA leaderboard standings at the segment deadline who confirm their intent to participate through the entry process will be considered a qualified athlete, eligible to compete in one of two groups as follows:
 - Group One: Qualified athletes whom are committed to participate on the PBR UTB Tour, will compete at the PBR OKC UTB
 - Group Two: A maximum of twelve (12) athletes consisting of the twelve highest ranked Bull Riders on the WCRA Leaderboard which are not qualified to the PBR UTB Tour, will compete at the LFBB
 - LFBB, 7pm February 1, 2020, Salt Lake City, UT
 - Two (2) pools of six athletes will compete in the Semi Finals with a total payout of \$27,500 per discipline.
 - Positions in each pool will be based on preferences given in priority of the athletes WCRA Leaderboard points standings as of the end of the segment.
 - Perf 2: Pools A and B

- Livestock will be designated to each pool.
- The stock will be drafted in order of the athlete's WCRA Leaderboard qualification.
 - Athletes must be present two hours prior to the start of the performance to draft their stock. If not present, the stock will be drawn for the athlete after the draft concludes.
- The two highest scores from each pool will advance to the WCRA \$1MM Major.
 - The number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is exempt to the WCRA \$1MM Major.
- If there is not one qualified score in a pool, the next position filled will be from the highest score, not already qualified, from any pool of that same performance. If there are still open spots in a pool to advance to the Major, the next spot will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard of that segment of the athletes in that pool with the open position(s).
- Four (4) athletes will advance to the WCRA \$1,000,000 Major on February 28, 2020 in Kansas City, MO.
- If the number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is included in the top 8 of the Semi Finals, WCRA will pick up the next highest score from that athlete's pool.
- The twelve (12) athletes competing at the LFBB will pay a \$250 entry fee.
- PBR UTB athletes in the top 24 of the WCRA Leaderboard competing in PBR's OKC UTB event will be eligible to compete to advance to the WCRA \$1MM Major. Top 4 highest scores from eligible athletes in the aggregate will advance. PBR athletes must confirm intent to compete.
 - Eight (8) athletes in each discipline will advance to the WCRA \$1,000,000 Major on February 28, 2020 in Kansas City, MO.
- Four (4) from the LFBB
- Four (4) from the PBR OKC UTB
- If the number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is included in the top 8 of the Semi Finals, WCRA will pick up the next highest score from that athlete's pool.
- **OKC UTB Rules**
 - Any UTB athletes that are in the top 12 of the top 24 athletes WCRA Leaderboard Standings as of the segment deadline will be eligible to compete to advance to WCRA's \$1MM Major.
 - All PBR athletes must enter the Semi-Finals through the WCRA VRQ entry tool to confirm their intent to compete.
 - Four (4) positions will be available to advance to WCRA \$1MM Major on February 28, 2020 in Kansas City, MO.
 - The positions will be earned by the four (4) highest qualified point earners from the aggregate of competition.
 - There will be no entry fees at the OKC UTB event for the WCRA Semi Finals competitors.
 - Format of OKC UTB
 - Round 1
 - Round 2

- Final Round
- OKC Event will serve as “clean slate” similar to WCRA Semi-Finals. Performance at OKC will qualify them to \$1MM WCRA Royal City Round Up Feb 28, 2020.

- **Instant Replay Rules**
 - INSTANT REPLAY RULING CHALLENGE: These rules and guidelines may be amended and revised from time to time based on the logistics of implementation, effects on TV programming, delays to events, and other practical logistics learned as these rules and procedures are implemented.
 - Instant replay could be a useful device to allow Judges, including a newly appointed Instant Replay Judge, to view a ride from several different angles and with slow motion. Where available, super slow motion may also be a useful tool.
 - WCRA will designate an Official as an Instant Replay Judge. The Instant Replay Judge’s decision is final.
 - An Athlete may call for an IRRC on his own ride only immediately after his ride, but not after he leaves the arena. He may do so by throwing a flag, to be located at both rider out-gates, timed event chutes or perhaps elsewhere. He will have 30 seconds to throw the flag.
 - Possible challenges for replay are identified in the rules of each discipline.
 - If there is no clock, until the judge’s stop watch reaches 30 seconds after the completion of a ride. If a rider is injured and is reasonably unable to get to the IRRC flag in time, he may signal a judge for an IRRC by a motion. If there is no flag at an event, it shall be the rider’s sole responsibility to alert the judges with the appropriate motion and confirmation for an IRRC.

PRELIMINARY ROUND:

CONSISTS OF:

1. Athletes entered from the WCRA Leaderboard Segment 4

ADVANCEMENT – 24 athletes move on from Preliminary Round to Progressive Round:

1. Athletes placing 1st – 4th in the first go of the Preliminary Round advance
 - a. If a placing position is tied in the go-round, ties creating the split below 5th place will be dropped – remaining advancement positions will be filled from the two-head average of Preliminary Round.
2. Athletes placing 1st – 4th in the second go of the Preliminary Round advance
 - a. If a placing position is tied in the go-round, ties creating the split below 5th place will be dropped – remaining advancement positions will be filled from the two-head average of the Preliminary Round.
3. All other advancement positions will be filled from the two-head average of the Preliminary Round in order of fastest combined aggregate times first.

TIE-BREAKERS IN GO-ROUND:

1. If a tie creates a split to 5th – all 5 athletes will advance
2. Any ties creating a split below 5th – positions creating that tie will NOT advance. Remaining advancement positions will be filled from the two-head average of the Preliminary Round.

TIE-BREAKERS IN TWO HEAD AVERAGE (AGGREGATE):

1. Fastest time in any Preliminary go-round
2. Highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4) (In Team Roping, it is based on the Team Roping combined points)

PROGRESSIVE ROUND:

CONSISTS OF 32 ATHLETES:

1. Eight (8) exempted from the WCRA Leaderboard Segment 4
2. 24 from Preliminary Round

ADVANCEMENT – 16 athletes move on from Progressive Round to Final Round:

1. Two fastest times in each Progressive Round pool advance to Final Round
2. If there are not two qualified times in a Progressive Round pool, the next position filled will be from the fastest time, not already qualified, from any Progressive Round pool.
3. If there are still open advancement positions in a pool, the next position(s) will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4) of the athletes in that Progressive Round pool with the open position(s). (In Team Roping, it is based on the Header Leaderboard.)

TIE-BREAKERS:

1. The highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4) (In Team Roping, it is based on the Team Roping combined points)

FINAL ROUND:

CONSISTS OF 16 ATHLETES:

1. Top eight (8) from WCRA Leaderboard
2. Eight (8) from Progressive Round

ADVANCEMENT – 8 athletes move on from Final Round to WCRA \$1MM Major

1. Four fastest times in each Final Round pool advance to WCRA \$1MM Major
2. If there are not four qualified times in a Final Round pool, the next position filled will be from the fastest time from any Final Round pool not already qualified.
3. If there are still open advancement positions in a pool, the next position(s) will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4) of the athletes in that Final Round pool with the open position(s). (In Team Roping, it is based on the Team Roping combined points)
4. If the number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is included in the top 8 of the Semi Finals, WCRA will pick up the next highest score from that athlete's pool.

TIE-BREAKERS:

1. Fastest time in the Progressive Round
2. The highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4) (In Team Roping, it is based on the Team Roping combined points)

BAREBACK RIDING:

Semi Finals:

CONSISTS OF UP TO 24 ATHLETES:

1. Twenty-four (24) athletes from the WCRA Leaderboard Segment 4

ADVANCEMENT – 8 athletes move on from Semi Finals to WCRA \$1MM Major

1. Two highest scores in each pool advance to WCRA \$1MM Major
2. If there are not two qualified scores in a pool, the next position filled will be from the highest score from any pool not already qualified
3. If there are still open advancement positions in a pool, the next position(s) will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4) of the athletes in that pool with the open position(s).

TIE-BREAKERS:

1. The highest combined *ride* score in the Final Round
2. Any one official with the highest *ride* score in the Final Round
3. The highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4)

SADDLE BRONC RIDING:

Semi Finals:

CONSISTS OF UP TO 24 ATHLETES:

2. Twenty-four (24) athletes from the WCRA Leaderboard Segment 4

ADVANCEMENT – 8 athletes move on from Semi Finals to WCRA \$1MM Major

4. Two highest scores in each pool advance to WCRA \$1MM Major
5. If there are not two qualified scores in a pool, the next position filled will be from the highest score from any pool not already qualified
6. If there are still open advancement positions in a pool, the next position(s) will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4) of the athletes in that pool with the open position(s).

TIE-BREAKERS:

4. The highest combined *ride* score in the Final Round
5. Any one official with the highest *ride* score in the Final Round
6. The highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4)

BULL RIDING

SEMI FINALS:

CONSISTS OF UP TO 24 ATHLETES:

1. 24 athletes from the WCRA Leaderboard Segment 4
 - a. 12 athletes will compete at the LFBB
 - b. 12 athletes will compete at the PBR OKC UTB

ADVANCEMENT – 4 athletes from each event above will move on to WCRA \$1MM Major

1. The highest score in each pool advance to WCRA \$1MM Major
2. If there is not one qualified score in a pool, the next position filled will be from the highest score from any pool not already qualified.
3. If there are still open advancement positions in a pool, the next position(s) will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4) of the athletes in that pool with the open position(s).

TIE-BREAKERS:

1. The highest combined ride score of the Semi Finals
2. Any one official with the highest ride score in the Semi Finals
3. The highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4)
4. The leader with the most money won on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 4)
5. Most number of nominations from Segment 4

WCRA Semi-Finals Segment 4 Payout

TIMED EVENTS: STEER WRESTLING, TEAM ROPING, TIE-DOWN ROPING, BARREL RACE, BREAKAWAY

*All athletes are subject to US tax law regarding withholdings from payout.

*Any non US resident completing any tax form other than a W9, WCRA will withhold 30% of earnings.

- **PRELIMINARY ROUNDS:**

- Consists of two (2) full rounds
- Entry Fees = \$250
- Office/Cattle Charge = \$50
- Net to Pot = \$200
- \$1,000 added in the average.

- EACH PRELIMINARY GO-ROUND:
 - Each go-round = 2/7th of net pot
 - Each go-round pays 4 positions (40%, 30%, 20%, 10%)

- TWO HEAD AVERAGE (AGGREGATE)
 - Average = 3/7th of net pot + \$1,000 added
 - Average pays 6 positions (29%, 24%, 19%, 14%, 9%, 5%)

- **PROGRESSIVE ROUND:**

- Each timed event discipline Progressive Round total payout = \$20,000 (\$5,000 paid in each pool)
- The Progressive Round payout for each pool will be as follows:

1 st Place	60%	\$ 3,000.00
2 nd Place	40%	\$ 2,000.00
TOTAL		\$ 5,000.00

- **FINAL ROUND:**

- Each timed event discipline Final Round total payout = \$35,000 (\$17,500 paid in each pool)
- The Final Round payout for each pool will be as follows:

3 rd Place	20%	\$ 3,500.00
4 th Place	10%	\$ 1,750.00
