



**STAMPEDE AT THE E – QUALIFYING ROUNDS
GROUND RULES PAYOUTS, ADVANCEMENT AND TIE-BREAKERS
AUGUST 11-14, 2020
LAZY E ARENA - GUTHRIE, OK**

1. SCHEDULE OF KEY DATES AND DEADLINES

2. TENTATIVE COMPETITION ORDER PER DISCIPLINE

- 2.1. With the exception of Barrel Racing qualifying rounds will run WCRA Pool followed by Open Pool then Youth Pool.
 - 2.1.1. OPEN Pools Round 1
 - 2.1.2. WCRA Pool Round 1
 - 2.1.3. OPEN Pools Round 2
 - 2.1.4. WCRA Pool Round 2
 - 2.1.5. Progressive Round
 - 2.1.6. DY Pool Round 1
 - 2.1.7. DY Pool Round 2
 - 2.1.8. Main Event

3. GENERAL GROUND RULES

- 3.1. The Stampede at the E (SATE) is open to:
 - 3.1.1. OPEN Timed Events: all athletes over the age of thirteen (13) years of age at the time of entry.
 - 3.1.2. Riding Events – all athletes over the age of eighteen at the time of competition.
 - 3.1.3. YOUTH Timed Events: all athletes thirteen (13) years of age through eighteen (18) years of age at the time of entry are eligible to participate.
 - 3.1.3.1. Breakaway Roping is limited to biological female athletes only.
- 3.2. SATE DISCIPLINES:
 - 3.2.1. WCRA & OPEN Qualifying Rounds - Tie Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping-Header, Team Roping-Heeler, Women’s Breakaway Roping, and Barrel Racing
 - 3.2.2. YOUTH Pool - Tie Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping-Header, Team Roping-Heeler, Women’s Breakaway Roping, and Barrel Racing
 - 3.2.3. MAIN EVENT - Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding, Bull Riding, Tie Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping-Header, Team Roping-Heeler, Women’s Breakaway Roping, and Barrel Racing
- 3.3. Competition Schedule:
 - 3.3.1. SATE Qualifying Rounds – August 11-14, 2020
 - 3.3.2. SATE Main Event – August 15, 2020
- 3.4. SATE Competition Committee reserves the right to modify these ground rules whether by addition to, deletion from, or modification of any rules as it deems necessary, without prior notice, to ensure fair competition.
 - 3.4.1. No rule changes will be made within a round of competition.

3.5. COVID Compliance:

- 3.5.1. The safety of SATE athletes, production crew, event staff, venue staff, exhibitors, spectators and everyone in the execution of this event is SATE staff's top priority.
- 3.5.2. SATE may implement safety guidelines based on recommendations from Federal, State, and Local officials along with the host venues and partner corporations' protocols in place at the time of the event. Safety guidelines will be provided to all participants (athletes, staff, etc.) prior to the start of the event.

3.6. DEFINITION: For avoidance of doubt and clarification as it applies to the SATE Main Event payout, the following defines the difference between an Event Champion and an Event Winner.

- 3.6.1. An Event Champion, that is eligible to earn the top payout in their discipline, has recorded a qualified time in the Final Round and "placed first" in the final event results.
- 3.6.2. An Event Winner, that is not eligible to earn the top payout in their discipline in the SATE Main Event, has not posted a qualified time in the Final Round.

3.7. Splits:

- 3.7.1. All timed event splits must be declared two hours before the event start time.

3.8. Turn Outs and Non-Entries:

- 3.8.1. If an eligible athlete qualified via the S6 Leaderboard does not enter during the designated entry time period, they will be replaced by the next eligible alternate from the master event athlete list.
- 3.8.2. If an eligible athlete qualified via the S6 Leaderboard draws out of the event before entries close, their position will be filled by the next eligible alternate from the master event athlete list.
- 3.8.3. If an eligible athlete qualified via the S6 Leaderboard turns out of the event after entries close, their position will be filled by the next eligible alternate.
 - 3.8.3.1. The penalty for a notified turnout is \$500.00 or forfeiture of all entry fees, whichever is greater.
 - 3.8.3.2. The penalty for a non-notified turnout is \$500.00 plus forfeiture of all entry fees and/or applicable stock charges associated with the entry. The athlete cannot participate in the WCRA platform until the penalty fee is paid.
 - 3.8.3.2.1. The athlete will not be allowed to earn a competition position at the event in the same discipline via alternate qualifying methods, inclusive of entry in the OPEN.
- 3.8.4. Any athlete that turns out and is not replaced within the designated time period or is a non-notified turn out, the athlete will not be eligible to participate in the WCRA platform for a minimum of the next WCRA segment and up to a maximum one (1) calendar year. The athlete will also forfeit any and all fees or payments made in relation to the ineligible WCRA segment.
 - 3.8.4.1. The ineligible period will be determined by the WCRA Competition Committee and an event Promoter Representative.
- 3.8.5. Turn Out Due to Doctor Release: Athlete must give notice to Event Arena Secretary no later than 3 days before his/her scheduled Performance, or upon the occurrence of a physical injury if it occurs less than 3 days before the Performance. In order to be eligible to be Excused, the Athlete must provide, prior to Athlete's first scheduled competition time, a written medical doctor verification on doctor's letterhead bearing the doctor's name, address and phone number, signed by a licensed doctor explaining the injury and recommending that the Athlete not compete in the Event. The doctor's note must be dated no later than 3 days after the alleged injury occurred.
- 3.8.6. Turn Out Due to Visible Injury: An Athlete may turn out due to visible injury, provided notification of such a turn out is authorized by official Event Sports Medicine trainer or Event doctor at Event.
- 3.8.7. Turn Out Due to Vet Releases: Vet releases will only be accepted in the Barrel Racing Discipline.
- 3.8.8. In the Team Roping, if a header or heeler notifies TO, NNTD, VIR, DR, or DO leaving an incomplete team, the next Athlete in the corresponding category (header or heeler) will be added to the team. If an alternate is not found prior to the Athlete's competition time, the

remaining partner may select another partner from among any of the Event Athletes already entered in Event, except those scheduled to compete in that same Discipline that have not already entered the maximum allowed times.

3.8.9. Other: SATE Competition Committee may Excuse an Athlete from competing in a Performance, staying at the Performance for the designated times, or otherwise altering the terms of the Athlete Agreement, but only in its sole and absolute discretion.

3.9. Trades

3.9.1. The SATE S6 event format negates the need for any trades.

3.9.2. All reasonable efforts will be made to ensure athletes participating in multiple disciplines will not have overlapping runs. If this issue occurs the athlete must notify the event secretary in advance of the event. The SATE Competition Committee will evaluate how to resolve the issue, if possible.

3.10. Timing & Scoring

3.10.1. Times in the Steer Wrestling, Team Roping, Tie-Down Roping and Breakaway Roping will be recorded to the hundredths of a second by handheld stopwatches.

3.10.2. Barrel Racing times will be recorded to the thousandths of a second by electronic eyes.

3.10.3. Riding Event disciplines will be scored in half points for both athlete and stock

3.11. Stock Draw

3.11.1. Timed Events:

3.11.1.1. Stock will be drawn at least two hours prior to the start of the competition.

3.11.1.1.1. If enough cattle, the WCRA Pool and OPEN Pool, when applicable as per the final competition schedule, stock draw for both rounds of competition will be drawn at the same time.

3.11.1.2. If there are not enough animals to complete a round of competition, subsequent stock will be included as needed.

3.11.1.3. Misdraw procedure will be determined by the event officials.

4. BARREL RACING GENERAL RULES

4.1. Barrel Racing Rollovers

4.1.1. Rollovers in the barrel racing will be accepted in the Stampede at the E qualifying rounds.

4.1.2. Rollovers will only be offered from the "WCRA Pool" qualifier rounds 1 and 2 to the "Open to the World Pool" qualifier rounds 1 and 2. Rollover times are not applicable to the Progressive or Main Event competition rounds.

4.1.3. For example:

WCRA Pool	Open Pool
Round 1 time = 16.50	Round 1 time = 16.50 (Rollover)
Round 2 time = 17.0	Round 2 time = 17.0 (Rollover)

4.1.4. All athlete's that wish to rollover their times from the "WCRA Pool" to the "Open Pool" will be required to roll both round 1 and round 2 times.

4.1.5. Athletes wishing to rollover their times from the "WCRA Pool" to the "Open Pool" must declare their intent prior to the start of the first round of the "WCRA Pool". All athletes that would like to rollover their time will have the opportunity to email eventsecretary@wcrarodeo.com prior to arriving at the event, or notifying the secretary at check-in.

4.1.6. For those that email in your notice, the following information is required:

4.1.6.1. Athlete Name:

4.1.6.2. Confirmation that you would like your "WCRA Pool" time to rollover and also count towards your "Open to the World Pool" time in both round 1 and 2.

4.1.7. Any athlete rolling over their time must pay the applicable entry fee for both pools and is eligible to win prize money and advancement just as if the time was run in both pools.

4.1.8. All athletes entered in both the "WCRA Pool" and "Open Pool" for rounds 1 and 2 will be included in the draw and will remain in the draw, regardless of whether they are rolling over their time or not.

- 4.1.9. Under no circumstances will the athlete be able to renounce their rollover once the competition has begun.
- 4.1.10. The pattern in the round of competition for the “Open to the World” and “WCRA Pool” must be exactly the same and must not be changed in any manner.
- 4.2. Barrel Racing Tractor Drag/Hand Rake
 - 4.2.1. WCRA, OPEN & YOUTH Qualifying Rounds
 - 4.2.1.1. Tractor drags will be determined based on total entries per pool. Not to exceed 10 runs per drag.
 - 4.2.1.2. SATE may choose to hand rake after every run
 - 4.2.2. Progressive Round Pools
 - 4.2.2.1. Tractor drag between each pool
 - 4.2.2.2. Hand rake after every run
 - 4.2.3. SATE Main Event
 - 4.2.3.1. Hand rake after every run

5. TEAM ROPING PAIRING & LEADERBOARD RULES

- 5.1. Once the competition pairings are set from the WCRA Leaderboard qualifiers; entries will open, and each individual Header and Heeler must enter the event through the Rodeo Logistics entry tool – EntryTool.com.
- 5.2. Headers/Heelers competing in the WCRA Pool Qualifying Rounds
 - 5.2.1. In the event there is an uneven number of headers/heelers, any vacancies must first be filled with the eligible headers/heelers from the master athlete alternate list.
 - 5.2.2. Once all eligible headers/heelers have declared a partner and all alternates have been exhausted, the remaining headers/heelers without a partner will be allowed to choose a partner from the remaining field of entered athletes.
- 5.3. WCRA Pool –
 - 5.3.1. Each athlete’s individual point total from the WCRA S6 Leaderboard as of July 26 at 11:59:59pmCT will determine qualification into the SATE.
 - 5.3.1.1. The #1 leaderboard positions will be seeded into the SATE Main Event.
 - 5.3.1.2. The #1 - #9 leaderboard positions will be seeded into the Progressive Round.
 - 5.3.1.3. The #10-64 leaderboard positions and any NWYI athletes not in the top 64 will qualify to participate in the WCRA Pool Qualifying Rounds.
 - 5.3.1.3.1. Combined partner point totals after the pairing deadline will determine the team’s competition placement within the WCRA Pool.
 - 5.3.1.3.1.1. All references to a Team Roping ranking and/or competition position once the pairings have been confirmed will be based on the combined team point total.
 - 5.3.2. At the conclusion of the segment cut off, all Headers and Heelers will first declare their partners via email prior to entries opening. A link to a live sheet will be shared with all header/heelers to see the pairings as they are sent in.
 - 5.3.2.1. A deadline will be set for those headers/heelers to confirm their partner.
 - 5.3.3. Once all pairings are declared, competition placement for the WCRA Pool will be determined based on the combined point totals between each team. The qualifications are as follows:
 - 5.3.3.1. The #10–64 competition positions will compete in the WCRA Pool Qualifying Rounds and will compete in reverse order of the Combined Points Leaderboard in Round 1.
 - 5.3.3.2. The #1-9 competition positions will compete in the Progressive Round.
- 5.4. SATE Main Event
 - 5.4.1. At the conclusion of the Progressive Pool Round, all Headers and Heelers that have qualified to participate in the Main Event will have the opportunity to select their partner from the list of athletes that qualified for the Main Event.
 - 5.4.1.1. The headers/heelers must confirm their partner with the event secretary within two (2) hours following the conclusion of the Progressive Round.
- 5.5. OPEN & YOUTH Team Pairings

- 5.5.1. OPEN Pool and YOUTH Pool athletes will declare their team partner at time of entry. Both team members must enter the event.

6. SATE HAS THREE PATHS OF PROGRESSION TO THE MAIN EVENT

6.1. Path #1 - WCRA Virtual Rodeo Qualifier (VRQ) Leaderboard

- 6.1.1. At the close of WCRA Segment 6 (S6) on July 26, 2020 at 11:59:59pm CT the top ranked athletes available in each discipline, per WCRA S6 leaderboard, who enter will be eligible to participate in the WCRA Pool of the SATE.

- 6.1.1.1. Timed Events – top sixty-four (64)

- 6.1.1.2. Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding & Bull Riding – top ten (10) will be seeded directly to the Main Event.

- 6.1.2. All athletes eligible to enter the WCRA Pool will be notified by WCRA via email and text with event entry details.

- 6.1.2.1. All eligible athletes that enter the WCRA Pool in the Timed Events will compete in qualifying rounds as described in these ground rules for an opportunity to participate in the SATE Main Event.

- 6.1.2.2. All references to a Team Roping competition position within the WCRA Pool will be based on the combined athlete point total.

- 6.1.3. All athletes that earned a generic qualification via a Nominate, Win & You're In (NWI) at events designated by WCRA, who enter will be eligible to participate in the WCRA Pool of the SATE.

- 6.1.4. A master event athlete list of eligible athletes will be created based on their WCRA Segment 6 Leaderboard position. Competition positions will be filled up to the number of available positions in each discipline as listed in these ground rules during the event entry time period. Eligible athletes that enter during the event entry time period that are not placed into a competition position will be placed on the master event athlete list as an alternate in order of their WCRA Leaderboard position.

- 6.1.5. S6 Leaderboard Qualification Benefits:

- 6.1.5.1. WCRA Leaderboard #1: as of the close of the WCRA Segment 6 on July 26, 2020.

- 6.1.5.1.1. Complimentary Seeded Entry in the SATE Main Event

- 6.1.5.1.2. One (1) complimentary stall rental for timed event athletes

- 6.1.5.1.3. Athlete may compete in the WCRA Progressive Round and/or the OPEN Pools to compete for the event payouts.

- 6.1.6. WCRA Leaderboard – Timed Events #2-16:

- 6.1.6.1. Complimentary Entry in the WCRA Pool

- 6.1.7. WCRA Leaderboard – Timed Events #17-64 and NWI Athletes will participate in qualifying rounds as described in these ground rules for an opportunity to advance to the SATE Main Event.

- 6.1.8. WCRA Leaderboard – Riding Events #1-10:

- 6.1.8.1. Complimentary Seeded Entry to the Main Event

- 6.2. Path #2 - Open to the World Qualifying Rounds (the OPEN) entries

- 6.2.1. Eligible athletes that enter the OPEN will participate in qualifying rounds as described in these ground rules for an opportunity to advance to the SATE Main Event.

- 6.3. Path #3 – Youth Open to the World Timed Events Qualifying Rounds (YOUTH)

- 6.3.1. All eligible athletes that enter the OPEN will participate in qualifying rounds as described in these ground rules for an opportunity to advance to the SATE Main Event.

- 7.3. WCRA Pool Qualifying Pool

- 7.3.1. Entries Open – August 4, 2020 at 9:00am CT

- 7.3.2. Entries Close – August 5, 2020 at 5:00pm CT

7.3.3. Entry Fee – complimentary for WCRA Leaderboard positions

7.3.3.1. Timed Events: #1-16

7.3.3.2. Riding Events: #1-10

7.3.4. Entry Fee – Timed Event Leaderboard athletes #17-64

7.3.4.1. Athletes #17-64 entering the WCRA Pool - \$250 per entry per discipline

7.4. Open to the World Qualifying Pools

7.4.1. Entry Fees: \$625 per entry

8. TOTAL ENTRIES PER ATHLETE PER DISCIPLINE

8.1. WCRA Leaderboard #1 – maximum one (1) entry and are seeded directly into the SATE Main Event and has the option to jackpot in the qualifying rounds.

8.2. WCRA S6 Leaderboard Athletes – maximum two (2) entries per discipline

8.2.1. WCRA Pool – one (1)

8.2.2. OPEN Pools – one (1)

8.3. OPEN Pool Athletes – maximum two (2) entries per discipline

8.3.1. Team Roping entry pairings in the OPEN may not be the same Header/Heeler pairing.

8.4. YOUTH Pool Athletes – maximum two (2) entries per discipline

8.4.1. A YOUTH athlete may not split their entries between the OPEN and YOUTH divisions and must decide by July 10, 2020 which division they chose to participate in.

8.4.2. Team Roping entry pairings in the YOUTH may not be the same Header/Heeler pairing.

8.4.3. YOUTH Pool Ground Rules will be included in a separate document. Available on the WCRA.com events page or by contacting support@wcrarodeo.com.

8.5. Bull Riding entry maximum per PBR competition rules

COMPETITION FORMAT, ADVANCEMENT & TIE-BREAKERS

Tie Breakers are for advancement purposes only – monies will remain split if tied

9. TEAM ROPING, TIE DOWN ROPING, STEER WRESTLING & BREAKAWAY ROPING:

9.1. PATH #1 – WCRA S6 LEADERBOARD

9.1.1. S6 LEADERBOARD #1– seeded directly to the SATE Main Event

9.1.2. S6 LEADERBOARD #1-9 – seeded directly to the Progressive Round

9.1.3. WCRA POOL QUALIFYING ROUNDS:

9.1.3.1. CONSISTS OF:

9.1.3.1.1. Athletes entered from the WCRA S6 Leaderboard #10-#64 and any NWYI generic qualifications

9.1.3.1.1.1. In Team Roping, it is based on the combined athlete's team points.

9.1.3.1.2. Two full rounds of competition

9.1.3.1.2.1. Round One – Reverse Order of the WCRA S6 Leaderboard

9.1.3.1.2.1.1. The competition order will be as follows:

9.1.3.1.2.1.1.1. Nominate, Win, You're In (if not in the top 64)

9.1.3.1.2.1.1.2. Disciplines with multiple NWYI seeded qualifications the competition order of the generic qualifications will be based on S6 Leaderboard position

9.1.3.1.2.1.1.3. WCRA Leaderboard Standings (64 – 10)

- 9.1.3.1.2.2. Round Two – Random Draw
- 9.1.3.2. ADVANCEMENT – 8 athletes move on from WCRA POOL Qualifying Rounds to the Progressive Round:
 - 9.1.3.2.1. Athletes placing 1st – 8th in the two-run aggregate of the Qualifying Rounds.
 - 9.1.3.2.2. Athletes are eligible to advance to the Progressive Pools once per entry for a maximum of two (2) Progressive pool competition positions.
 - 9.1.3.2.2.1. If an athlete qualifies for both the WCRA & OPEN Progressive Pools, but chooses to only participate in one (1) Progressive pool for any reason, that competition position will default to the advancing competition position with the fastest combined times of the two-run aggregate. The vacated competition position will be filled by the next eligible athlete from those respective Qualifying Rounds.
 - 9.1.3.2.2.2. If the advancing positions are tied, then the competition position will default to the OPEN Progressive pool and the vacated competition position will be filled by the next eligible athlete from the WCRA Qualifying Rounds.
- 9.1.3.3. TIE-BREAKERS IN TWO RUN AGGREGATE:
 - 9.1.3.3.1. Fastest time in any WCRA Pool Qualifying Round
 - 9.1.3.3.2. Highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 6) (In Team Roping, it is based on the combined athletes' team points).
- 9.2. PATH #2 – OPEN TO THE WORLD QUALIFYING ROUNDS
 - 9.2.1. OPEN POOL QUALIFYING ROUNDS:
 - 9.2.1.1. CONSISTS OF:
 - 9.2.1.2. All eligible athletes that entered the event via EntryTool.com during event entry times listed in Section 7.4 of these ground rules
 - 9.2.1.2.1. Two full rounds of competition
 - 9.2.1.2.1.1. Round One – Reverse Order of entry (first to enter, last to run)
 - 9.2.1.2.1.1.1. Barrel racing will be in order of first to enter, first in drag
 - 9.2.1.2.1.1.2. All entries via the EntryTool.com app have a recorded timestamp to the one/one-thousandth (1/1000th) of a second.
 - 9.2.1.2.1.1.2.1. This format also applies to Late Entries.
 - 9.2.1.2.1.2. Round Two – Random Draw
 - 9.2.1.3. ADVANCEMENT – A minimum of 8 and maximum of 16 athletes move on from the OPEN POOL Qualifying Rounds to Progressive Round based on the two-run aggregate.
 - 9.2.1.3.1. Any unfilled positions in the Progressive Round from the Open Qualifying Rounds due to less than 121+ entries will be filled by athletes from the WCRA Qualifying Rounds aggregate.
 - 9.2.1.3.2. Athletes are eligible to advance to the Progressive Pools once per entry for a maximum of two (2) Progressive pool competition positions.
 - 9.2.1.3.2.1. If an athlete qualifies for both the WCRA & OPEN Progressive Pools, but chooses to only participate in one (1) Progressive pool for any reason, that competition position will default to the advancing competition position with the fastest combined times of the two-run aggregate. The vacated competition position will be filled by the next eligible athlete from those respective Qualifying Rounds.
 - 9.2.1.3.2.2. If the advancing positions are tied, then the competition position will default to the OPEN Progressive pool and the vacated competition position will be filled by the next eligible athlete from the WCRA Qualifying Rounds.
 - 9.2.1.3.3. Total number of advancement positions will be based on total entries per discipline and per the chart below. WCRA reserves the right to modify the total advancing positions as needed.
 - 9.2.1.3.3.1. 1-50 entries = 8 qualifiers
 - 9.2.1.3.3.2. 51 – 60 entries = 9 qualifiers

- 9.2.1.3.3.3. 61 – 70 entries = 10 qualifiers
- 9.2.1.3.3.4. 71 – 80 entries = 11 qualifiers
- 9.2.1.3.3.5. 81 – 90 entries = 12 qualifiers
- 9.2.1.3.3.6. 91 – 100 entries = 13 qualifiers
- 9.2.1.3.3.7. 101 – 110 entries = 14 qualifiers
- 9.2.1.3.3.8. 111 – 120 entries = 15 qualifiers
- 9.2.1.3.3.9. 121+ entries = 16 qualifiers
- 9.2.1.3.4. Total number of advancing positions based on known entries per discipline at the close of the main entry window are:
 - 9.2.1.3.4.1. Breakaway Roping - 9
 - 9.2.1.3.4.2. Tie-Down Roping - 8
 - 9.2.1.3.4.3. Steer Wrestling – 8
 - 9.2.1.3.4.4. Team Roping Header – 8
 - 9.2.1.3.4.5. Team Roping Heeler – 8
- 9.2.1.3.5. Athletes must have at least one (1) recorded qualified time in the OPEN Qualifying Rounds to be eligible to advance to the Open Progressive Pool
- 9.2.1.3.6. The unfilled positions in the OPEN Progressive Pool will be filled by eligible athletes from the WCRA Qualifying Rounds.
- 9.2.1.4. TIE-BREAKERS PROGRESSIVE ROUND ADVANCEMENT:
 - 9.2.1.4.1. Fastest time in 2nd Round of the OPEN Qualifying Rounds
 - 9.2.1.4.2. Fastest time in 1st Round of the OPEN Qualifying Rounds
 - 9.2.1.4.3. Highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 6) (In Team Roping, it is based on the combined athletes' team points).
- 9.3. PROGRESSIVE ROUND:
 - 9.3.1. No competition times from the Preliminary Rounds move forward to the Progressive Round except when needed to break a tie per the Advancement/Tie-Breaker rules in these Ground Rules.
 - 9.3.2. Up to Thirty-three (33) athletes in each timed event discipline will compete in the Progressive Round.
 - 9.3.2.1. Progressive Round Athletes:
 - 9.3.2.1.1. WCRA Progressive Pool - 17 athletes
 - 9.3.2.1.1.1. 9 - WCRA Leaderboard #1-9
 - 9.3.2.1.1.2. 8 - WCRA Qualifying Pool
 - 9.3.2.1.2. OPEN Progressive Pool – 16 athletes
 - 9.3.2.1.3. (8-16) – OPEN Qualifying Pool
 - 9.3.2.1.3.1. WCRA Qualifying Pool athletes are eligible to fill open competition positions in the Progressive Pool #2 per Section 9.2.1.3.4 of these ground rules
 - 9.3.3. The athletes will be divided into two (2) Pools
 - 9.3.3.1. The order of competition within each pool will be set by random draw.
 - 9.3.3.2. The four (4) fastest times, in each Progressive Pool will advance to the Main Event.
 - 9.3.3.3. If there are not four (4) qualified times in a pool, the next position filled will be from the fastest time, not already qualified, from any Progressive Round pool. If there are still open spots in a pool to advance to the Final Round, the next spot will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard of that segment, of the athletes in that pool, with the open position(s).
 - 9.3.4. ADVANCEMENT –
 - 9.3.4.1. Nine (9) athletes (including the #1 ranked athlete from the S6 leaderboard) in each discipline will advance to the Main Event
 - 9.3.4.1.1. Four (4) fastest times from the WCRA Progressive Pool
 - 9.3.4.1.2. Four (4) fastest times from the OPEN Progressive Pool
 - 9.3.4.1.3. If the number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is included in the top 4 of either Pool, WCRA will pick up the next fastest time from that athlete's pool.

9.3.5. TIE-BREAKERS:

9.3.5.1. Fastest time in any previous WCRA Pool or OPEN Qualifying round

9.3.5.2. Highest ranked athlete on the WCRA S6 Leaderboard (In Team Roping, it is based on the combined athletes' team points).

10. BARREL RACING:

10.1. PATH #1 – WCRA S6 LEADERBOARD

10.1.1. S6 LEADERBOARD #1 – seeded directly to the SATE Main Event

10.1.2. S6 LEADERBOARD #1-9 – seeded directly to the Progressive

10.1.3. WCRA POOL QUALIFYING ROUNDS:

10.1.3.1. CONSISTS OF:

10.1.3.1.1. Athletes entered from the WCRA S6 Leaderboard #10-#64

10.1.3.1.2. Two full rounds of competition

10.1.3.1.2.1. Round One – based on WCRA leaderboard positions, top of the ground)

Example - based on 36 athletes in a round with a drag after 5:

- 8 drags will run in the round.
- The first 5 athletes based on Leaderboard position will be placed in the 1, 6, 11... positions so they are the first to compete following a drag.
- The next set of athletes will be placed in the 2, 7, 12... positions so they are the second to compete following a drag.

10.1.3.1.2.1.1. The same process would be used for each run position until all athletes are placed in the round based on their Leaderboard position.

10.1.3.1.2.2. Round Two – Random Draw

10.1.3.1.2.2.1. An athlete is not required to complete their scheduled competition run in the second round if the athlete deems their first-round qualified time will advance them to the Progressive Round.

10.1.3.1.2.2.1.1. The athlete must notify the event secretary if they decide not to participate in the second round within two (2) hours following the conclusion of the first round of their pool so the subsequent position draw can be completed.

10.1.3.2. ADVANCEMENT – 8 athletes move on from Qualifying Rounds to Progressive Round:

10.1.3.2.1. The top eight (8) fastest runs from two (2) rounds of competition (NOT THE AGGREGATE) will advance.

10.1.3.2.2. Athletes are eligible to advance to the Progressive Pools once per entry for a maximum of two (2) Progressive pool competition positions.

10.1.3.2.2.1. If an athlete qualifies for both the WCRA & OPEN Progressive Pools, but chooses to only participate in one (1) Progressive pool for any reason, that competition position will default to the advancing competition position with the fastest time over two (2) rounds, not the aggregate. The vacated competition position will be filled by the next eligible athlete from those respective Qualifying Rounds.

10.1.3.2.2.2. If the advancing positions are tied, then the competition position will default to the OPEN Progressive pool and the vacated competition position will be filled by the next eligible athlete from the WCRA Qualifying Rounds.

10.1.3.3. TIE-BREAKERS IN COMBINED ROUNDS:

10.1.3.3.1. If a tie creates a split to 9th – all 9 athletes will advance

10.1.3.3.2. Any ties creating a split below 9th – positions creating that tie will be split based on S6 Leaderboard standings.

10.2. PATH #2 – OPEN TO THE WORLD QUALIFYING ROUNDS

10.2.1. OPEN POOL QUALIFYING ROUNDS:

- 10.2.1.1. CONSISTS OF:
- 10.2.1.2. All eligible athletes that entered the event via EntryTool.com during event entry times listed in Section 7.4 of these ground rules
- 10.2.1.2.1. Two full rounds of competition
- 10.2.1.2.1.1. Round One – based on time of entry (first to enter, top of the ground)
- Example - based on 150 athletes in a pool with a drag after 5:
- 30 drags will be done in the pool.
 - The first 30 athletes based on entry time, per pool, will be placed in the 1, 6, 11... positions so they are the first to compete following a drag.
 - Athletes 31-60 will be placed in the 2, 7, 12... positions so they are the second to compete following a drag.
- 10.2.1.2.1.1.1. The same process would be used for each run position until all athletes are placed in the pool based on their time of entry. All entries via the EntryTool.com app have a recorded timestamp to the one/one-thousandth (1/1000th) of a second.
- 10.2.1.2.1.1.1.1. This format also applies to Late Entries.
- 10.2.1.2.1.2. Round Two – Random Draw
- 10.2.1.2.1.2.1. An athlete is not required to complete their scheduled competition run in the second round if they deem their first-round qualified time will advance them to the Progressive Round.
- 10.2.1.2.1.2.2. The athlete must notify the event secretary if they decide not to participate in the second round within two (2) hours following the conclusion of the first round of their pool so the subsequent position draw can be completed.
- 10.2.1.2.2. ADVANCEMENT– A minimum of 8 and maximum of 16 athletes move on from the OPEN POOL Qualifying Rounds to the Progressive Round based on top fastest runs from two (2) rounds of competition (NOT THE AGGREGATE) Any unfilled positions in the Progressive Round from the Open Qualifying Rounds due to less than 121+ entries will be filled by athletes from the WCRA Qualifying Rounds.
- 10.2.1.2.3. Athletes are eligible to advance to the Progressive Pools once per entry for a maximum of two (2) Progressive pool competition positions.
- 10.2.1.2.3.1. If an athlete qualifies for both the WCRA & OPEN Progressive Pools, but chooses to only participate in one (1) Progressive pool for any reason, that competition position will default to the advancing competition position with the fastest time over two (2) rounds, not the aggregate. The vacated competition position will be filled by the next eligible athlete from those respective Qualifying Rounds.
- 10.2.1.2.3.2. If the advancing positions are tied, then the competition position will default to the OPEN Progressive pool and the vacated competition position will be filled by the next eligible athlete from the WCRA Qualifying Rounds.
- 10.2.1.2.4. Total number of advancement positions will be based on total entries per discipline and per the chart below. WCRA reserves the right to modify the total advancing positions as needed.
- 10.2.1.2.4.1. 1-50 entries = 8 qualifiers
- 10.2.1.2.4.2. 51 – 60 entries = 9 qualifiers
- 10.2.1.2.4.3. 61 – 70 entries = 10 qualifiers
- 10.2.1.2.4.4. 71 – 80 entries = 11 qualifiers
- 10.2.1.2.4.5. 81 – 90 entries = 12 qualifiers
- 10.2.1.2.4.6. 91 – 100 entries = 13 qualifiers
- 10.2.1.2.4.7. 101 – 110 entries = 14 qualifiers
- 10.2.1.2.4.8. 111 – 120 entries = 15 qualifiers

- 10.2.1.2.4.9. 121+ entries = 16 qualifiers
- 10.2.1.2.5. Total number of advancing positions based on known entries per discipline at the close of the main entry window are:
 - 10.2.1.2.5.1. Barrel Racing - 8
 - 10.2.1.2.6. Athletes must have at least one (1) recorded qualified time in the OPEN Qualifying Rounds to be eligible to advance to the Open Progressive Pool
 - 10.2.1.2.7. The unfilled positions in the OPEN Progressive Pool will be filled by eligible athletes from the WCRA Qualifying Rounds.
- 10.2.1.3. TIE-BREAKERS PROGRESSIVE ROUND ADVANCEMENT:
 - 10.2.1.3.1. Fastest time in 2nd Round of the OPEN Qualifying Rounds
 - 10.2.1.3.2. Fastest time in 1st Round of the OPEN Qualifying Rounds
 - 10.2.1.3.3. Highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard (Segment 6)

10.3. PROGRESSIVE ROUND:

- 10.3.1.1. No competition times from the Preliminary Rounds move forward to the Progressive Round except when needed to break a tie per the Advancement/Tie-Breaker rules in these Ground Rules.
- 10.3.1.2. Up to Thirty-three (33) athletes in each timed event discipline will compete in the Progressive Round.
- 10.3.1.3. Progressive Round Athletes:
 - 10.3.1.3.1. WCRA Progressive Pool - 17 athletes
 - 10.3.1.3.1.1. 9 - WCRA Leaderboard #1-9
 - 10.3.1.3.1.2. 8 - WCRA Qualifying Pool
 - 10.3.1.3.2. OPEN Progressive Pool – 16 athletes
 - 10.3.1.3.3. (8-16) – OPEN Qualifying Pool
 - 10.3.1.3.3.1. WCRA Qualifying Pool athletes are eligible to fill open competition positions in the Progressive Pool #2 per Section 10.2.1.2.2 of these ground rules
- 10.3.1.4. The athletes will be divided into two (2) Pools
 - 10.3.1.4.1. The order of competition within each pool will be set by random draw.
 - 10.3.1.4.2. The four (4) fastest times, in each Progressive Pool will advance to the Main Event.
 - 10.3.1.4.3. If there are not four (4) qualified times in a pool, the next position filled will be from the fastest time, not already qualified, from any Progressive Round pool. If there are still open spots in a pool to advance to the Final Round, the next spot will be filled from the highest ranked athlete on the WCRA Leaderboard of that segment, of the athletes in that pool, with the open position(s).

10.3.2. ADVANCEMENT –

- 10.3.2.1. Nine (9) athletes (including the #1 ranked athlete from the S6 leaderboard) in each discipline will advance to the Main Event
 - 10.3.2.1.1. Four (4) fastest times from the WCRA Progressive Pool
 - 10.3.2.1.2. Four (4) fastest times from the OPEN Progressive Pool
 - 10.3.2.1.3. If the number one athlete from the WCRA Leaderboard is included in the top 4 of either Pool, WCRA will pick up the next highest score from that athlete's pool.

10.3.3. TIE-BREAKERS:

- 10.3.3.1. Fastest time in any previous WCRA Pool or OPEN Qualifying round
- 10.3.3.2. Highest ranked athlete on the WCRA S6 Leaderboard

11. SATE MAIN EVENT:

11.1. CONSISTS OF:

- 11.1.1. Timed Events: 10 Athletes:
 - 11.1.1.1. 1 - #1 from WCRA S6 Leaderboard
 - 11.1.1.2. 4 – WCRA Progressive Pool
 - 11.1.1.3. 4 – OPEN Progressive Pool
 - 11.1.1.4. 1 – YOUTH Qualifying Rounds
 - 11.1.1.4.1. Athletes are eligible to advance to the Main Event once per discipline.

11.1.1.4.1.1. If an athlete qualifies to the Main Event more than, the advancing competition position will default to the fastest recorded qualified time for that athlete. The vacated competition position will be filled by the next eligible athlete from the respective Progressive Pool.

11.1.2. Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding & BULL RIDING: 10 Athletes

11.1.2.1. 1 - #1-10 from WCRA S6 Leaderboard

11.2. Main Event Ground Rules will be included in a separate document. Available on the WCRA.com events page or by contacting support@wcrarodeo.com.

12. INSTANT REPLAY RULING CHALLENGE

12.1. INSTANT REPLAY RULING CHALLENGE (IRRC): These rules and guidelines may be amended and revised from time to time based on the logistics of implementation, effects on TV programming, delays to events, and other practical logistics learned as these rules and procedures are implemented.

12.1.1. Instant replay is a useful device to allow Judges to view a ride/run from several different angles and with slow motion. Where available, super slow motion may also be a useful tool.

12.1.2. WCRA will designate a Lead Judge as an Instant Replay Judge.

12.1.3. The athlete, any competition official or a WCRA Competition Committee member may call for an IRRC after a ruling is made.

12.1.3.1. In the Bull Riding discipline, per PBR Rules - Other Contestants may instigate an IRRC on rides of others also, by sounding the horn within the 30 second time limit after the completion of a ride. A Contestant sounding the horn must immediately make it known that he is the one requesting an IRRC on another Contestant by waving his arms and pointing to himself. If that is not done, or if it is not clear who requested the IRRC, no IRRC will be effectuated as determined by any Judge.

12.1.3.2. If a Contestant calls for an Instant Replay Ruling Challenge (IRRC) for his/her own ride/run, and if the Instant Replay Judge upholds the original ruling, that Contestant will be charged \$500 for calling for the IRRC.

12.1.3.3. Reviewable calls or actions available to athletes are listed with these Competition Rules and may include variations in the event specific Ground Rules under each discipline.

12.1.3.4. Certain reviewable calls or actions are predicated by the athlete declaring themselves at the time of the alleged action. The definition of declaring is the athlete immediately notifies the competition officials and ceases their competition run. If an athlete notifies the official of a declaration but continues to make their competition ride/run, the declaration will be voided.

12.1.4. An athlete may call for an IRRC on their own ride/run only immediately after their ride/run, but not after they leave the arena. They may do so by throwing an IRRC flag, to be located at both athlete out-gates, timed event chutes or perhaps elsewhere. The athlete will have 30 seconds to throw the flag. If there is no clock, until the judge's stopwatch reaches 30 seconds after the completion of a ride. If an athlete is injured and is reasonably unable to get to the IRRC flag in time, the athlete may signal a judge for an IRRC by a motion. If there is no flag at an event, it shall be the athlete's sole responsibility to alert the judges with the appropriate motion and confirmation for an IRRC.

12.1.5. Other athletes may instigate an IRRC on rides/runs of others also, by throwing the flag within the 30 second time limit after the completion of a ride/run. An athlete that throws the flag must immediately make it known that they are the one requesting an IRRC on another athlete by identifying their self to the competition officials. If that is not done, or if it is not clear who requested the IRRC, no IRRC will be effectuated as determined by any Judge.

12.2. If it is deemed that an athlete has called for an IRRC for their own ride/run is a flagrant misuse of the IRRC, and the Instant Replay Judge upholds the original ruling, that athlete will be charged \$500 for calling for the IRRC.

12.3. Additional Bull Riding discipline IRRC rules per the PBR rulebook

12.3.1. TOUCHING BULL, EQUIPMENT OR PERSON WITH FREE HAND AND OR ARM AND OR EXTENSION: Touching bull, equipment, or person with free hand, and/or arm, and/or extension will be automatically reviewed. When reviewing a disqualification for touching the bull, if the replay judge cannot find conclusive evidence that the athlete touched the bull using all available angles, the athlete will not be disqualified for touching the bull.

12.3.2. Scores are not subject to an IRRC. Only challenges pertaining to reaching 8 seconds (or not), disqualifications (or not) pertaining to slapping or touching the bull with free hand or arm, fouls, or catching spurs in bull rope or knots are matters that are subject to an IRRC. The Field Judge that is the official start time may ask for a review of the start time of the ride if he feels there was an error, in which case the Replay Judge would need to time the ride in real time with a handheld stopwatch. This is the only time where a start time can be reviewed.

12.3.3. If an athlete is disqualified for excessive time in the chute, but the chute was opened and the athlete completed an 8 second ride, that ride shall be subject to automatic video review.

13. **STAMPEDE AT THE E PAYOUTS**

*All athletes are subject to US tax law regarding withholdings from payout.

*ALL non-US resident athletes must complete a W-8BEN tax form, 30% of any earnings due will be withheld.

13.1. **PAYOUT:**

13.1.1. Stampede at the E discipline estimated payout is based on total known entries per discipline following the close of all entry windows. Payout contained in these ground rules are an estimated example for reference. Actual and final payout will be based on final entry numbers at start of the first round of competition.
