- WCRA NOMINATIONS: athletes are eligible to nominate their competitive efforts toward the WCRA Virtual Rodeo Qualifier (VRQ) for Segment Leaderboards until April 10, 2022 at 11:59pm CT.
- ELIGIBLE ATHLETES:
  - Athletes are required to have a minimum of fifteen (15) VRQ points on the WCRA Segment Leaderboards Leaderboard in a discipline to be eligible to enter RCC.
  - BB, SB, BR – up to 27 (24 VRQ Leaderboard and 3 Outside Qualifiers chosen at the discretion of RCC committee and WCRA).
    - #1 Segment RCC22 Leaderboard athlete seeded in Showdown Round and is eligible to participate in Progressive Round for payout
  - TD, TR-HDR, TR-HLR, SW, BAW, GBR – up to Top 48 from WCRA Segment RCC22 Leaderboard and up to Top 8 from WCRA DY Leaderboard
    - #1 Segment RCC22 Leaderboard athlete seeded in Showdown Round and is eligible to participate in Qualifying Rounds and Progressive Round for payout
    - #2-4 Segment RCC22 Leaderboard athlete seeded in Progressive Round and is eligible to participate in Qualifying Rounds for payout
  - SR – up to Top 64 from WCRA Segment SR22 Leaderboard
    - #1-#4 Segment SR22 Leaderboard athlete seeded in Showdown Round and is eligible to participate in Progressive Round for payout

**2. DEFINITION:**

- 2.1. The phrase “Segment Leaderboards” refers to all WCRA Segments (Segments RCC22, SR22, DY) related to the 2022 Rodeo Corpus Christi event collectively and applied separately based on the rule context.

**3. RODEO CORPUS CHRISTI - ATHLETE PARTICIPATION ELIGIBILITY**

- 3.1. At the close of WCRA Segments RCC22, SR22 and DY on April 10, 2022 at 11:59:59pm the top ranked eligible athletes available in each discipline of the WCRA Segment Leaderboards as of the final points audit on April 14, 2022, per the totals listed below in these ground rules and who enter the event will be eligible to participate in Rodeo Corpus Christi (RCC).
  - 3.1.1. Timed Events (Tie Down Roping, Team Roping, Steer Wrestling, Breakaway Roping and Barrel Racing) – up to forty-eight (48) athletes/teams
  - 3.1.2. Timed Events (Steer Roping) – up to sixty-four (64) athletes
  - 3.1.3. DY Timed Events (Tie Down Roping, Team Roping, Steer Wrestling, Breakaway Roping and Barrel Racing) – up to eight (8) athletes/teams
  - 3.1.4. Riding Events (Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding & Bull Riding) – up to twenty-seven (27) athletes will be seeded directly to the WCRA Progressive Round (24 VRQ Leaderboard and 3 Outside Qualifiers chosen at the discretion of RCC committee and WCRA).
    - 3.1.4.1. Bull Riding athletes must be a current member, and in good standing, of Professional Bull Riders, Inc. (PBR).

      - 3.1.4.1.2. PBR Velocity Tour level points are applied to the athletes per PBR protocols.
  - 3.1.5. Athletes on the Segment Leaderboards must have a minimum of fifteen (15) VRQ points in a discipline to be eligible to enter RCC.
  - 3.1.6. Athletes on the Segment Leaderboards that have not earned the minimum amount of VRQ points required to be eligible to enter the event, are eligible to “enter” the event as an alternate. Alternates will be added to the event per Rule 3.4 and Rule 3.6.1 of these ground rules.
- 3.2. All athletes eligible to enter RCC will be notified by WCRA via email and text with event entry details.
  - 3.2.1. All eligible athletes that enter RCC in the Timed Events will participate in Qualifying Rounds as described in these ground rules for an opportunity to participate in the RCC WCRA Major.
    - 3.2.1.1. All references to a Team Roping Leaderboard position will be based on the combined team’s point total.
  - 3.2.2. All eligible athletes that enter RCC in the Riding Events will participate in the WCRA Progressive Round as described in these ground rules for an opportunity to participate in the RCC WCRA Major.
    - 3.2.2.1. WCRA recognizes the dates of Rodeo Corpus Christi overlap the PBR World Finals. As a PBR affiliated event, any PBR athlete that is eligible to enter RCC, but also qualifies to and elects to participate in the PBR World Finals will have all nomination fees paid toward Segment RCC22 credited to their account to be used toward Segment DO47 (Days of ’47 Rodeo) in Salt Lake City. Any nomination credit not used toward Segment DO47 will not be extended to any future segment and will be voided.
- 3.3. All eligible athletes that earned a generic qualification at events designated by WCRA, who enter will be eligible to participate in the WCRA Qualifying Rounds of RCC.

- 3.4. A master event athlete list of eligible athletes will be created based on their WCRA Segment Leaderboard position. Competition positions will be filled up to the number of available positions in each discipline as listed in these ground rules during the event entry time period. Eligible athletes that enter during the event entry time period that are not placed into a competition position will be placed on the master event athlete list as an alternate in order of their WCRA Segment Leaderboard position.
- 3.5. A master event athlete list of eligible athletes will be created based on their position on the WCRA Segment Leaderboards following the final points audit on April 14, 2022. Competition positions will be filled up to the number of available positions in each discipline as listed in this section of these ground rules during the event entry time period. Eligible athletes that enter during the event entry time period that are not placed into a competition position will be placed on the master event athlete list as an alternate in order of their WCRA Segment Leaderboard position.
- 3.6. In the case that a discipline does not meet the minimum number of eligible athletes at the close of the nomination window, the number of athletes eligible to enter RCC will be based on the following chart:

- 3.6.1. If the RCC Competition Committee adds an athlete, as an alternate or for any other reason, to the RCC athlete roster that has not participated in the WCRA Segment Leaderboards or earned the required minimum number of VRQ points during Segment RCC22, SR22, or DY; he or she must nominate the RCC event for WCRA Segment DO47 (or SR23/DY23 as applicable) and may be subject to an additional \$300 fee.
- 3.7. WCRA Leaderboard Qualification Benefits:
  - 3.7.1. WCRA RCC22 Leaderboard #1-4: as of the close of the WCRA Segment RCC22 on April 10, 2022.
  - 3.7.2. Timed Events (Tie Down Roping, Team Roping, Steer Wrestling, Breakaway Roping and Barrel Racing)
    - 3.7.2.1. Leaderboard #1 athlete/team will be seeded to RCC Showdown Round and is eligible to participate in all qualifying rounds for prize money payout.
    - 3.7.2.2. Leaderboard #2-4 athletes/teams will be seeded to WCRA Progressive Round and is eligible to participate in all qualifying rounds for prize money payout.
  - 3.7.3. Timed Events (Steer Roping)
    - 3.7.3.1. Leaderboard #1-#4 athlete/team will be seeded to RCC Showdown Round and is eligible to participate in all qualifying rounds for prize money payout.
  - 3.7.4. Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding & Bull Riding
    - 3.7.4.1. Leaderboard #1 athlete will be seeded to RCC Showdown Round and is eligible to participate in WRCA Progressive Round for prize money payout.
4. **GENERAL GROUND RULES**
  - 4.1. To ensure fair and safe competition, the WRCA Competition Committee reserves the right to modify these ground rules whether by addition to, deletion from, or modification of any rules as it deems necessary, without prior notice.
    - 4.1.1. Any requests for rule changes or modifications must be submitted to the WCRA Competition Committee, who will then review and approve prior to enforcing any rule modifications or edits.
    - 4.1.2. No rule changes will be made within a round of competition.
  - 4.2. Rules of Competition are contained in a separate document available on the [WCRARodeo.com](http://WCRARodeo.com) events page or by contacting [support@wcrarodeo.com](mailto:support@wcrarodeo.com)
  - 4.3. INSTANT REPLAY RULING CHALLENGE (IRRC) rules are included in the WCRA Rules of Competition document available on the [WCRARodeo.com](http://WCRARodeo.com) events page or by contacting [support@wcrarodeo.com](mailto:support@wcrarodeo.com)
  - 4.4. The Rodeo Corpus Christi (RCC) is open to:
    - 4.4.1. Timed Events: all athletes over the age of thirteen (13) years of age at the time of entry.
    - 4.4.2. Riding Events – all athletes over the age of eighteen (18) at the time of competition.
    - 4.4.3. YOUTH Timed Events: all athletes thirteen (13) years of age at the time of entry through nineteen (19) years of age as of May 9, 2022 are eligible to participate.
    - 4.4.4. Breakaway Roping is limited to biological female athletes only.
  - 4.5. RCC DISCIPLINES:
    - 4.5.1. WCRA Qualifying Rounds – Tie Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping-Header, Team Roping-Heeler, Women's Breakaway Roping, Steer Roping and Barrel Racing

- 4.5.2. WCRA Progressive Rounds – Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding, Bull Riding, Tie Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping-Header, Team Roping-Heeler, Women’s Breakaway Roping, Steer Roping and Barrel Racing
- 4.5.3. YOUTH Pool in Qualifying Rounds - Tie Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping-Header, Team Roping-Heeler, Women’s Breakaway Roping, and Barrel Racing
- 4.5.4. WCRA MAJOR - Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding, Bull Riding, Tie Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, Team Roping-Header, Team Roping-Heeler, Women’s Breakaway Roping, and Barrel Racing
- 4.6. Competition Schedule:
  - 4.6.1. RCC Steer Roping - all competition rounds – May 8, 2022
  - 4.6.2. RCC Timed Event Qualifying Rounds – May 9-10, 2022
  - 4.6.3. RCC WCRA Progressive Round – May 11-13, 2022
  - 4.6.4. RCC WCRA Major – May 14, 2021
- 4.7. Only actual contestant and one companion allowed gate access for ticketed rodeo performances on the day(s) the athlete is scheduled to participate.
  - 4.7.1. Additional event tickets may be purchased at <https://bucdays.com/tickets/> or at the box office day of show.
- 4.8. Athlete Check In:
  - 4.8.1. All athletes must check-in with secretary and complete and sign a release of liability before competing.
  - 4.8.2. ALL ATHLETES WITH HORSES – Must check-in with the rodeo secretary and present current required Texas Animal Health Commission documents
- 4.9. ALL Athletes will be required to wear back number, which must be worn or displayed in its entirety at all times in the competition arena during the paid performances.
- 4.10. PERFORMANCE PARKING at American Bank Center - Athlete parking area is located under the bridge at enter at 500 Brewster Street. Fastest route to parking is to Exit Hwy 37 at Port Ave and take Port Ave to Tanchua, turn right and enter parking at 500 Brewster Street.
- 4.11. COVID and General Health Welfare Compliance:
  - 4.11.1. The safety of RCC athletes, production crew, event staff, venue staff, exhibitors, spectators, and everyone in the execution of this event is RCC staff’s top priority.
  - 4.11.2. RCC may implement safety guidelines based on recommendations from Federal, State, and Local officials along with the host venues and partner corporations’ protocols in place at the time of the event. Safety guidelines will be provided to all participants (athletes, staff, etc.) prior to the start of the event.
  - 4.11.3. The Competition Committee reserves the right to follow up on any information received that an athlete may be experiencing adverse health conditions that could compromise the health other people. Pending the verification of this information, the Competition Committee may take the appropriate measures it deems necessary to ensure the safety of all participants, personnel, and spectators of the event. These measures may range from added safety protocols to be exercised by the appropriate parties up to the removal of an athlete from the event.
- 4.12. DEFINITION: For avoidance of doubt and clarification as it applies to the RCC WCRA Major payout, the following defines the difference between an Event Champion and an Event Winner.
  - 4.12.1. An Event Champion is a Athlete/Team that has recorded the highest score/fastest time in the Triple Crown of Rodeo Round **and** has placed first in the final event results of his/her discipline solely by himself/herself. To be an Event Champion, Athlete/Team must meet all Triple Crown of Rodeo eligibility requirements. Athletes/Teams with tied scores/times in the Triple Crown of Rodeo Round are not considered Event Champions. An Event Champion **is** eligible for the Triple Crown of Rodeo bonus program
  - 4.12.2. An Event Winner has not posted a qualified score/time in the Triple Crown of Rodeo Round **and/or** has not placed first in the final results of his/her discipline solely by himself/herself but rather is in a tied situation for first. Event Winners **have not** met the minimum Triple Crown of Rodeo requirements and are **NOT** eligible for the Triple Crown of Rodeo bonus program.
- 4.13. Splits:
  - 4.13.1. All timed event splits must be declared one (1) hour before the event start time.
- 4.14. Turn Outs and Non-Entries:
  - 4.14.1. If an eligible athlete qualified via a Segment Leaderboard does not enter during the designated entry time period, they will be replaced by the next eligible alternate from the master event athlete list.
  - 4.14.2. If an eligible athlete qualified via a Segment Leaderboard draws out of the event before entries close, their position will be filled by the next eligible alternate from the master event athlete list.
  - 4.14.3. If an eligible athlete qualified via a Segment Leaderboard turns out of the event after entries close, their position will be filled by the next eligible alternate.
    - 4.14.3.1. The penalty for a notified turnout is \$500.00 or forfeiture of all entry fees, whichever is greater.
    - 4.14.3.2. The penalty for a non-notified turnout is \$500.00 plus forfeiture of all entry fees and/or applicable stock charges associated with the entry. The athlete cannot participate in the WCRA platform until the penalty fee is paid.

- 4.14.3.2.1. The athlete will not be allowed to earn a competition position at the event in the same discipline via alternate qualifying methods, inclusive of entry in the OPEN.
- 4.14.4. Any athlete that turns out and is not replaced within the designated time period or is a non-notified turn out, the athlete will not be eligible to participate in the WCRA platform for a minimum of the next WCRA segment and up to a maximum one (1) calendar year. The athlete will also forfeit any and all fees or payments made in relation to the ineligible WCRA segment.
- 4.14.4.1. The ineligible period will be determined by the WCRA Competition Committee and an event Promoter Representative.
- 4.14.5. Turn Out Due to Doctor Release: Athlete must give notice to Event Arena Secretary no later than 3 days before his/her scheduled Performance, or upon the occurrence of a physical injury if it occurs less than 3 days before the Performance. In order to be eligible to be Excused, the Athlete must provide, prior to Athlete's first scheduled competition time, a written medical doctor verification on doctor's letterhead bearing the doctor's name, address and phone number, signed by a licensed doctor explaining the injury and recommending that the Athlete not compete in the Event. The doctor's note must be dated no later than 3 days after the alleged injury occurred.
- 4.14.6. Turn Out Due to Visible Injury: An Athlete may turn out due to visible injury, provided notification of such a turn out is authorized by official Event Sports Medicine trainer or Event doctor at Event.
- 4.14.7. Turn Out Due to Vet Releases: Vet releases will only be accepted in the Barrel Racing Discipline and must be on signed letterhead from a licensed veterinarian.
- 4.14.8. In the Team Roping, if a header or heeler notifies TO, NNTO, VIR, DR, or DO leaving an incomplete team, the next Athlete in the corresponding category (header or heeler) will be added to the team. If an alternate is not found prior to the Athlete's competition time, the remaining partner may select another partner from among any of the Event Athletes already entered in Event, except those scheduled to compete in that same Discipline that have not already entered the maximum allowed times.
- 4.14.9. Other: RCC Competition Committee may Excuse an Athlete from competing in a Performance, staying at the Performance for the designated times, or otherwise altering the terms of the Athlete Agreement, but only in its sole and absolute discretion.
- 4.15. Trades
- 4.15.1. The RCC event format will allow competition position trades in the WCRA Progressive Round only.
- 4.15.1.1.1. Athletes are allowed a maximum of two trades.
- 4.15.1.2. Timed Event Seeded athletes in the WCRA Progressive Round are only allowed to trade with other seeded athletes in their respective discipline
- 4.15.2. Trade deadline schedule is:
- 4.15.2.1. Bareback Riding, Saddle Bronc Riding & Bull Riding trades:
- 4.15.2.1.1. Open on Friday, April 22, 2022 @ 12:00pm CT. All trades must be submitted to WCRA at [eventsecretary@wcrarodeo.com](mailto:eventsecretary@wcrarodeo.com). All athletes involved in a trade must submit the trade request for the trade to be approved.
- 4.15.2.1.2. Close at 5:00pm CT on Monday, May 9, 2021
- 4.15.2.2. Barrel Racing trades:
- 4.15.2.2.1. Open as soon as the Progressive Round draw is posted, approximately 30 minutes following the round competition. Trades will be managed on site at the Rodeo Secretary office.
- 4.15.2.2.2. Close at 7:00pm CT on Monday, May 9, 2021
- 4.15.2.3. Team Roping, Tie-Down Roping, Steer Wrestling, & Breakaway Roping trades:
- 4.15.2.3.1. Open as soon as the Progressive Round draw is posted, approximately 30 minutes following the round competition. Trades will be managed on site at the Rodeo Secretary office.
- 4.15.2.3.2. Close at 7:00pm CT on Tuesday, May 10, 2021
- 4.15.3. It the athlete's responsibility to verify an approved trade and be ready to participate in the performance they are scheduled for. If an athlete does not participate in their scheduled performance, they will be listed as a Non-Notified Turn Out and will be subject to the rules in Section 4.13 of these ground rules.
- 4.15.4. Steer Roping – the competition format negates the need for any trades.
- 4.16. Timing & Scoring
- 4.16.1. All announced scores/times and scoreboard displays of scores/times are unofficial until the judges/timers sheets have been verified by the event secretary
- 4.16.2. Timed Event competition will start behind a rope barrier and will be timed by handheld plungers from the PBR Scoring System.
- 4.16.2.1. Times in the Steer Wrestling, Team Roping, Tie-Down Roping, Steer Roping and Breakaway Roping will be recorded to the hundredths of a second.

- 4.16.3. Barrel Racing times will be recorded to the thousandths of a second by electronic eyes. Dual timers eyes will be used. One set of timer eyes will be the primary recorded time. The secondary timer eyes will be the first back up time used.
- 4.16.4. If backup times from stopwatches are required to be used at any time during the event competition a minimum of two (2) handheld stopwatches will be used and averaged to record times to:
  - 4.16.4.1.1. Team Roping and Breakaway Roping – the tenths of a second.
  - 4.16.4.1.2. Barrel Racing – the hundredths of a second.
- 4.16.5. Riding Event disciplines will be scored in half points for both athlete and stock

## **5. STOCK DRAW**

- 5.1. An Athlete may draw/draft a competition animal that they have previously competed on during the event based on the following:
  - 5.1.1. The animal is not redrawn during a segment of the competition that includes an aggregate.
  - 5.1.2. The athlete redraws the competition animal in a subsequent round or set of rounds during the event that starts as a clean slate.
- 5.2. Timed Events:
  - 5.2.1. Stock will be drawn at least two hours prior to the start of the competition each performance.
  - 5.2.2. The stock will be drawn in order of the athlete's WCRA merged RCC22 and DY Leaderboard ranking per performance
    - 5.2.2.1. Progressive Round stock will be the fastest times from the Qualifying Rounds.
    - 5.2.2.2. TCR Round and Showdown Round stock will be from the fastest runs from the combined Progressive Round performances.
      - 5.2.2.2.1. TCR Round stock will be from the top three (3) fastest runs in the Progressive Round. The next fastest runs from the Progressive Round will be used in the Showdown Round inclusive of two (2) extras.
      - 5.2.2.2.2. If not enough qualified times, the combined Qualifying Rounds times will be used.
  - 5.2.3. TCR Round – The stock will be drafted immediately following the discipline conclusion in the Showdown Round at the rodeo secretary office. Draft will be in order of advancement with fastest time/highest score drafting first.
  - 5.2.4. If a timed event animal escapes, or a re-run is due for any other reason during a performance, the extra will be used. Only escaped animals go back into the herd.
  - 5.2.5. Steer Roping - Extras will be used to replace sick or injured animals. (The misdraw procedure will not be used).
  - 5.2.6. RCC Competition Committee reserves the right select the appropriate stock from the competition herd to be used in the Progressive Round, Showdown Round and/or Triple Crown Round. Selection of this stock may or may not be based on previous competition times within a discipline.
  - 5.2.7. Misdraw procedure will be determined by the event officials.
- 5.3. Riding Events:
  - 5.3.1. Progressive & Showdown rounds - The stock will be drafted in order of the athlete's WCRA Leaderboard qualification per performance (highest position picks first).
    - 5.3.1.1. Athletes must be present at 4:30pm prior to the start of the performance to draft their stock. If not present, the stock will be randomly drawn for the athlete after the draft concludes.
  - 5.3.2. TCR Round – The stock will be drafted immediately following the discipline conclusion in the Showdown Round at the rodeo secretary office. Draft will be in order of advancement with highest score drafting first.
  - 5.3.3. Livestock will be designated to each performance.

## **6. BARREL RACING GENERAL RULES**

- 6.1. Barrel Racing Tractor Drag/Hand Rake
  - 6.1.1. WCRA Qualifying Rounds
    - 6.1.1.1. Tractor drags will be after every 5 runs.
  - 6.1.2. Progressive Round Pools
    - 6.1.2.1. Hand rake after every run
  - 6.1.3. RCC WCRA Major
    - 6.1.3.1. Hand rake after every run

## **7. TEAM ROPING PAIRING & LEADERBOARD RULES**

- 7.1. Athletes are not allowed to have more than one (1) identical Header/Heeler pairing combination at any time during the event.
  - 7.1.1. A paired combination must maintain the pairing during any advancement rounds the team has qualified to participate in as long as there are no identical team pairings participating in the event.

- 7.2. Once the competition pairings are set from the WCRA Leaderboard qualifiers; entries will open, and each individual Header and Heeler must enter the event through the Rodeo Logistics entry tool – EntryTool.com.
- 7.3. Headers/Heelers competing in the WCRA Qualifying Rounds
  - 7.3.1. In the event there is an uneven number of headers/heelers, any vacancies must first be filled with the eligible headers/heelers from the master athlete alternate list.
  - 7.3.2. Once all eligible headers/heelers have declared a partner and all alternates have been exhausted, the remaining headers/heelers without a partner will be allowed to choose a partner from the remaining field of entered athletes.
    - 7.3.2.1.1. Once an eligible athlete selects a competition partner from the field of entered and eligible athletes to complete the team pairing, the selected partner athlete will be required to pay all applicable nomination/entry fees. The added athlete will be eligible for all payouts and advancement opportunities.
- 7.4. WCRA Leaderboard –
  - 7.4.1. Each eligible athlete's individual point total from the Segment Leaderboards final audited standings as of April 14 will determine eligibility to participate in RCC.
    - 7.4.1.1. Segment RCC22 Leaderboard - the top 48 Headers and top 48 Heelers will be eligible to participate in Rodeo Corpus Christi.
      - 7.4.1.1.1. Combined partner point totals after the pairing deadline will determine the team's competition placement in the Qualifying Rounds.
      - 7.4.1.1.2. The #1 team based on combined leaderboard points will be seeded into the RCC WCRA Showdown Round.
      - 7.4.1.1.3. The #2-4 teams based on combined leaderboard points will be seeded into the WCRA Progressive Round.
    - 7.4.1.2. Segment DY Leaderboard - the top 8 Headers and top 8 Heelers will be eligible to participate in Rodeo Corpus Christi.
      - 7.4.1.2.1. Combined partner point totals after the pairing deadline will determine the team's competition placement in the Qualifying Rounds.
      - 7.4.1.2.2. The combined leaderboard positions (RCC22 & DY) and any athletes with generic qualifications not in the top 48 will qualify to participate in the WCRA Qualifying Rounds.
    - 7.4.1.3. All references to a Team Roping ranking and/or competition position once the pairings have been confirmed will be based on the combined team's point total.
  - 7.4.2. At the conclusion of the segment cut off, all Headers and Heelers will first declare their partners via email prior to entries opening. A link to a live sheet will be shared with all header/heelers to see the pairings as they are sent in.
    - 7.4.2.1. A deadline will be set for those headers/heelers to confirm their partner.
  - 7.4.3. Once all pairings are declared, competition placement for the WCRA Pool will be determined based on the combined point totals between each team. The qualifications are as follows:
    - 7.4.3.1. All entered teams will be eligible to participate in the WCRA Qualifying Rounds with the competition order in reverse order of the Combined Points Leaderboard in Round 1.
    - 7.4.3.2. The #1-4 Leaderboard positions are seeded into subsequent rounds of competition and are not required, but are eligible, to compete in the Qualifying Rounds.
- 7.5. Any heeler 55 years of age or older and any female heeler may tie on hard and fast.
- 7.6. Leaderboard RCC22 & DY Team Pairings
  - 7.6.1. OPEN Pool and DY Pool athletes will declare their team partner at time of entry. Both team members must enter the event.

## 8. INCENTIVE SIDE POTS

- 8.1. Incentive side pots will be held for all eligible DY athletes and all eligible Steer Roping athletes designated as a "B" Roper. Only these athletes are eligible for the side pot payouts. They are also eligible to earn prize money from the main payout.
  - 8.1.1. DY LEADERBOARD: TEAM ROPING – HEADING, TEAM ROPING - HEELING, TIE DOWN ROPING, STEER WRESTLING, BREAKAWAY ROPING AND BARREL RACING
    - 8.1.1.1. All eligible DY athletes that enter in RCC and participate in the WCRA Qualifying Rounds will be eligible to earn the DY Incentive for their respective discipline(s).
    - 8.1.1.2. The DY Incentive will be based on competitive efforts within the WCRA Qualifying Rounds. The incentive payout will be paid on the two-run aggregate for all DY athletes. Subsequent rounds of competition (Progressive, Showdown, and TCR) are not included in the DY Incentive.
      - 8.1.1.2.1. Athletes must record at least one (1) qualified time to be eligible for the DY Incentive.
      - 8.1.1.2.2. The DY Incentive will pay two (2) places. Their payout amount is listed in the Payout Section of these ground rules.
  - 8.1.2. DY LEADERBOARD: BARREL RACING

- 8.1.2.1. All eligible DY athletes that enter in RCC and participate in the WCRA Qualifying Round will be eligible to earn the DY Incentive for their respective discipline.
- 8.1.2.2. The DY Incentive will be based on competitive efforts within the WCRA Qualifying Round. The incentive payout will be paid on the fastest times for all DY athletes. Subsequent rounds of competition (Progressive, Showdown, and TCR) are not included in the DY Incentive.
  - 8.1.2.2.1. Athletes must record at least one (1) qualified time to be eligible for the DY Incentive.
  - 8.1.2.2.2. The DY Incentive will pay two (2) places. Their payout amount is listed in the Payout Section of these ground rules.

#### 8.1.3. STEER ROPING LEADERBOARD: "B" ROPERS

- 8.1.3.1. All eligible athletes classified as a "B" Roper that enter in RCC and participate in the WCRA Qualifying Rounds will be eligible to earn the "B" Roper Incentive for their respective discipline.
  - 8.1.3.1.1. Classification of "B" Ropers will be determined after the final audit of the Top 64 athletes on the WCRA SR22 Leaderboard is completed. WCRA will consult with regional associations to verify athlete classification.
- 8.1.3.2. The "B" Roper Incentive will be based on competitive efforts within the WCRA Qualifying Rounds. The incentive payout will be paid on the three-run aggregate for all "B" Roper athletes. Subsequent rounds of competition (Progressive and Showdown) are not included in the "B" Roper Incentive.
  - 8.1.3.2.1. Athletes must record at least one (1) qualified time to be eligible for the "B" Roper Incentive.
  - 8.1.3.2.2. The "B" Roper Incentive will pay two (2) places in each round and four (4) places in the three-run aggregate. The payout amount is listed in the Payout Section of these ground rules.

8.2. In the event that there are no qualified recorded times in any rounds of competition within a DY or "B" Roper Incentive Pool, no incentive payouts will be made for that respective discipline(s). The unused incentive payout for an incentive discipline will be added to the aggregate of the main payout for the respective discipline(s).

### 9. RCC COMPETITION PROGRESSION TO THE WCRA MAJOR

- 9.1. In the Riding Events - If there is only one (1) or no qualified scores in a Progressive Round performance, athlete(s) will advance based on:
  - 9.1.1. Highest score from any Progressive Round performance that has not already advanced.
  - 9.1.2. If no qualified scores are available, the longest ride time from any Progressive Round performance that has not already advanced.
  - 9.1.3. If highest score or longest ride times are tied as applicable, the tie-breaker rules in this section will be used to break the tie.
- 9.2. Timed Event Athletes:
  - 9.2.1. Athlete must have at least one (1) recorded qualified time in the WCRA Qualifying Rounds to be eligible to advance to the WCRA Progressive Round
    - 9.2.1.1. If no qualified times are available, the next highest ranked athlete from the RCC22 Leaderboard will advance.
  - 9.2.2. In the Timed Events - If there is only one (1) or no qualified times in a Progressive Round performance, athlete(s) will advance based on:
    - 9.2.2.1. Fastest Time from combined Progressive Round performances that has not already advanced.
    - 9.2.2.2. If qualified times are tied, the tie-breaker rules in this section will be used to break the tie.
    - 9.2.2.3. If no qualified times are available, the next highest ranked athlete from the RCC22 Leaderboard will advance.
